Work along The Leat, Chobham

Contract 1 - cleaning the stream and vertical banks twice in 2020

This work must be completed during April 2020 well ahead of Chobham Carnival, marking the VE Day 75th Anniversary on 8th May and then in late summer/early autumn 2020

The extent of the work extends along the length of the Leat stream from just beyond Benham's Corner where it starts to flow alongside the High Street to the road bridge where the Leat joins the Bourne.

Please note, if you are also quoting for contract 2 and 3, please price on the basis of each item of work being a standalone contract. If contractors offer an additional discount for undertaking more than one contract this may be taken into consideration, but each contract will be initially considered individually.

- All necessary plant, labour and materials should be included.
- We will strive to settle your valid invoice within 30 days of receipt. Please advise with your quotation if a deposit or part-payment is required for this work.
- We require all contractors to have public liability insurance and will request a copy of the current cover when awarding work.
- Three references for similar work are also required

Frequency: twice - in April 2020 and in late summer/early autumn 2020

1. To clear the sides and bottom of the Leat of all weeds and remove from the site.
2. To cut the grass on the vertical banks. Clear all arisings from the site.
Please note that cutting the grass on the adjacent verge above the stream is NOT included in this contract.
3. To remove the silt and debris from the Leat bed by hand and remove from the site.
4. To rake through the stone bed to remove under silt so that water is flowing.
5. All debris must be cleared from site, including from adjacent path areas to leave clean and tidy on completion

6. Should a skip be used, it should be well lit and fenced as appropriate to protect the public.
7. A skip and any temporary barriers should be removed on completion.
8. If machinery is being used and access to the Leat is needed from the roadside, costs for a two-way traffic management scheme should be included in the quotation.
